Re: Outcome of the External Quality Assurance Audit and Decision on Initial Provider Accreditation – Global Management Business School (GMBS)

Dear Mr. Miroslav Škoda,

This is to inform you that, during its meeting held on 18th June 2026, the Quality Assurance Committee (QAC) reviewed the External Quality Assurance Audit Report submitted by the Independent Peer Review Panel following the External Quality Assurance Audit of Global Management Business School (GMBS), conducted as part of the institution's application for Initial Provider Accreditation.

The Independent Peer Review Panel evaluated the institution against the applicable Standards of the External Quality Assurance Framework (Standard 10 was not applicable to this evaluation). The panel concluded that:

- Standards 3, 5 and 9 were Fully Compliant;
- Standards 1, 2, 4, 7 and 8 were Substantially Compliant;
- Standards 6 and 11 were Partially Compliant; and
- None of the Standards were Non-Compliant.

The External Quality Assurance Audit Report, enclosed with this letter, forms an integral part of this decision and sets out the evidence, findings, recommendations and compliance judgements on which the outcome is based.



Following its review of the External Quality Assurance Audit Report, the Quality Assurance Committee determined that Global Management Business School (GMBS) has not demonstrated the compliance required for Initial Provider Accreditation. Therefore, the

Committee recommended that Initial Provider Accreditation be refused. The MFHEA Board subsequently endorsed this recommendation.

This letter constitutes the Authority's final decision in relation to the Initial Provider Accreditation process as per Reg. 37(1)(a) of S.L.607.03, following the External Quality Assurance Audit. This decision has been taken in accordance with Reg. 37(3) of S.L.607. and the Authority's External Quality Assurance Framework.

You have the right to appeal this decision within twenty (20) calendar days from the date of this letter, in accordance with the Authority's Appeals Procedure. Please note that any programme accreditation previously granted by the Authority remains valid. However, in the absence of an institutional licence, the institution is not authorised to deliver any accredited programme. The programme accreditation took in consideration the online learning platform submitted as part of the provider accreditation. Therefore, if an accredited programme were to be transferred or sold, it may require reaccreditation.

Where programme accreditation applications are still in progress, the institution is requested to notify the Authority in writing within ten (10) working days of receipt of this letter whether it wishes to proceed with those applications. Please note that applicable fees already incurred remain payable and are non-refundable in accordance with the Authority's procedure.
